## SURVEILLANCE PLAN DETAILS OF SAMPLES FOR ODISHA BASING ON HIGH RISK INSPECTIONS 2021-22

The Surveillance was planned as per the high risk Inspections and FBOs serving High risk Foods. The Prepared foods were commonly and regularly sampled from all Districts and the Milk, Milk products along with Fish, Meat and egg were restricted to mainly the Highly populated areas of the ULBS including the Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Puri, Berhampur, Rourkela and sambalpur. There was inclusion of the Eat Right challenge activities under the surveillance sampling and the districts of Gajapati, Sambalpur, Balasore and Cuttack has surveillanced samples prioritising the sea foods ,spices along with sweets and confectioneries. The Private Laboratories were also engaged in the Surveillance purpose with the help of MoU funds and it also helped in carrying the surveillance at a faster rate. The details of the samples lifted under surveillance is given below.
